

## Voces para Sor Juana (Voices for Sor Juana)

Among the actions that will be taking place from the Foundation of the International Festival of Classical Theater of Almagro to commemorate in 2019 the presence of Mexico as the guest country of honor, the project *Voces para Sor Juana* (Voices for Sor Juana) makes of its vindicate and international nature the essence of the project.

How do the feminist and vindicate ideas of Sor Juan Inés de la Cruz sound now days?

To accomplish this project, we ask for a gesture of complicity to Women's Associations, Institutions, Embassies, Drama Schools, friends, sisters, neighbors, couples, public and private theaters: a recording of a short fragment of the poem *Foolish Men (Hombres Necios)* from the great Mexican author interpreted by female faces on their original language.

The union of all the voices in their different languages will be exhibited in a creative video piece during the next Almagro Festival in the Church of San Blas from July 5 to July 28, 2019.

The technical requirements for the recording are listed below:

- Format: 16:9 of proportion
  (We recommend 1.920 x 1.080 pixels in mp4 at 10.000 b/seg of bit rate)
- Recording with fixed camera and tripod, white background and preferably with natural lighting.
- In case of recording with a mobile device must be in horizontal position and taking care of the sound.
- The video must be delivered by WeTransfer to the email produccion3@festivaldealmagro.com
- Delivery deadline: 05/27/2019
- Please specify in each video the name of the participant.
